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

ABOUT **ANÓNIMO**

Anónimo is a contemporary art platform that started as an anonymous auction where the concealment of authorship remained until the piece is sold to the highest bidder. A platform that has evolved into a muti-destination art initiative whose main purpose is to encourage the purchase of art as a process free of preconceived ideas, motivated only by the connection that an anonymous piece can generate.

ART AUCTION

Anónimo has been searching for ways to materialize the concept of revaluation of the work of art by its face value vs. its economic value. Through its multi-city anonymous art auctions, Anónimo has created a scenario where the public has successfully achieved independent conversations with each piece, free from preconceived ideas about the author's career, gallery representation or market value. By eliminating the details of the authorship, the public has effectively experienced an anonymous purchase based only on a personal and emotional appreciation to each work of art.



After four successful editions in Miami during Art Week, the latest at the Faena Forum and The Bass Museum of Art; a sold out edition in Mexico City's Tamayo Museum, and a its first Textile edition in Oaxaca; Anónimo presents a new wave of thematic editions that celebrate contemporary interpretations of millenary craftsmanship, skills and techniques. A further exploration that aims to focus on the talent and ancestral beauty of the hand of the artist.

As the Anónimo platform expands into new destinations and forms of artistic expression, a variety of special editions are being envisioned and purposely curated to respond to their geographic and environmental context. Giving birth to a collective of site-specific editions that can evolve out of the art auction rule book and explore new and fresh ways to appreciate and approach the daring complexities of today's art world.

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



In collaboration with Further and Design Hotels, Anónimo presents a Marfa site specific edition of solo show commissioned project rooms with interactive art, site-specific installations and exhibitions that respond to the West Texas town artistic, geographic, and environmental context.

Having the vast desert as framework, the Marfa Project Rooms edition is a multi-dimensional space that takes over the Basic Hotel showcasing six different artistic expressions that celebrate contemporary interpretations of Prime Elements and Prime Matter:

CHARCOAL—WOOD—TEXTILE LIGHT—SOUND—CHROMA



The selected anonymous artists take over each room and offer the public an immersive experience around their own contemporary views, explorations, and interpretations of each category that unravel in three main sections: installation, body of work, and interactive art experience.

To honor Marfa's close relationship with the Mexican border, all works in this exhibition are produced in Mexico by Mexican artist or artists living or producing art in Mexico.

CHROMATIC STUDIES OF ENDANGERED SPECIES

Anonymous Artist





Around 1,500 species of plants and animals, some classified as endangered or in a state of vulnerability, are found within the five corridors of binational habitats along the border between Mexico and the United States. Blocking them with a concrete barrier would mean their inevitable disappearance due to the fragmentation of their natural habitats, soil erosion and the degradation of connectivity between landscapes, water and food supplies; as well as mating areas, which ensure the survival of Biodiversity in the area.

Jaguars, bighorn sheep and Sonoran pronghorn from northern Mexico have much to lose with a border wall. The entire desert ecosystem would be severely affected.

The project CHROMA for ANÓNIMO/ MARFA is based on the scientific research "Nature Divided, Scientists United: US-Mexico Border Wall Threatens Biodiversity and Binational Conservation" published in 2018 by Defenders of Wildlife



and the The International Union for Conservation of Nature's Red List of Threatened Species (IUCN Red List); to identify and classify species of plants and animals that, nowadays, are located or wander freely across the border within a land threshold of 20,000 km² between both countries. The population status of the chosen species for this art project is currently under the terrible category of DECREASING and most classify in a state of vulnerability or endangered.

The project establishes a poetic approach towards the color combinations of plants and animals that soon will cease to exist due to human interventions in the landscape, as consequence of socio-political notions in face of the border territory.

CHROMA is conformed by a series of sculptures, light boxes and drawings, forming a chromatic catalog, as a cabinet of curiosities, of the species that are at risk of disappearing. Developing a color code of 5 hues that are characteristic to each species. The 3 sculptures TUMBLEWEEDS take as inspiration the spherical and organic forms of the Russian thistles (Salsola tragus), which arrived







in 1873 with Russian immigrants in South Dakota. These invaders, that arrived as immigrants from around the world, quickly sprouted. They tumble to disseminate their seeds through broader territories. Hopefully, other species could spread, as easily and effectively as tumbleweeds do, through their natural habitats again.



Using Orozco's notebooks as a reference, that set forth essential matters in formal realization such as order, foresight and geometric rigor, the artist develops a series of paintings titled "Rebote cósmico", where time, structure, space, light and darkness are the main actors. A series of pictorial works in coal and gold leaf reflect the dialogues created by light bouncing of the edges of an architectural landscape and reveal the luminous peculiarities articulated in relation to the whole. An alternative vision in relation to the geometric reflection and the expansion of space, which could propose new models with alternative structures to the automated and mechanized system of modernity. Alluding to a dialectic between light and darkness,











confronted in this series, comes the interest in studying one of the chapters of production and research on the abstract form of one of the most important Mexican artists, José Clemente Orozco. A series of works that addressed an interest in

geometric composition and the compositional study of form, are revealed in Metaphysical Landscape, 1948, oil on canvas, which suggests a landscape that moves away from the material world and is unattainable to reason, it shows us a glimpse to the door of "death" and exhibits desolation in a line that hypnotizes us in the same way as would happen when observing the cold and dark profiles of an open grave.

The evolution process that vascular plants endured more than 650 million years ago allowed them to exit the oceans and give birth to their colonization on firm land. It is not an overstatement to say that the world as we know it exists as a product of this event.

The plant kingdom is our most ancient link to life; throughout history it has functioned as both a regulator and the foundation of our living ecosystems. Trees grow through a complicated chemical process in which the atmosphere's carbon dioxide is transformed into carbon and oxygen is released into the atmosphere, making life possible.

Trees were our origin, we evolved through them and once we descended onto the Earth's surface, the symbiotic process that links us to them prevailed and took on infinite courses. The origins of our civilization are founded on trees.

In these seemingly hopeless times, we realize that our survival depends on recovering the balance that prevailed between the plant kingdom and our species for 99.9% of history.

Our land is full of bones is an installation that invites the visitor to reflect on trees and the implications they have over our existence, as it pays tribute to those who today seek the vestiges of their children buried in our indifference.

Our country has been in the middle of a civil war for 13 years that has claimed the lives of at least 250,000 people who are mostly in a condition of missing persons. Hundreds of thousands of individuals are pulverized in our territory waiting to be observed.

When in a young age, the artist learned that generations of holiday decorations, specifically tree toppers, had been left behind when the family moved to Miami from Puerto Rico. The loss of these objects, embedded with years of individual memories, activated a response of obsessively recollecting discarded light objects from second hand stores all over the world, including Mexico, Europe and the Caribbean basin.

For Anonimo Marfa the artist presents a project conceived of the light elements collected particularly through his travels throughout Mexico, thus creating an environment composed of various mediums, including large murals that attempt to blend and embrace each artwork within the space. He does this mixing and blending to allude to the idea that the future is in an eternal communion with the past, and only when we reach out to the source is when we can be liberated of the polemics of time. In the artworks presented here the artist delivers these (childhood memories) illuminated objects again, repurposed, while playing with the past and future in a symbiotic relationship that cannot be separated. The resulting artworks in the form of wall assemblages, murals and prints seems to be transformed into magical vehicles of light, ritualistic objects to be worshipped empowered by their past, their memories.

These artworks remind us of our relationship to objects and that objects can be loaded with memories and it is the artist role to re-activate them, as if to remind us that to play with the future is to play with the past.











In a cultural moment when many are obsessed with a state of permanent future, the artist goes back and re-activates the past by looking directly into the source, bringing it into the present and the future in an eternal dance where rituals, syncretisms and personal memories become universal.




This far West Texas landscape with its endless horizons and boundless opportunity reminds us of our shared history planted deep in the soil. Undocumented and documented humans alike share this air we breathe and land we inhabit. The interactivity between human, air and land is a mystery that can only be experienced within a higher awareness by stimulating the senses.

This audio/visual installation is a collaboration between Mexico City director and a composer/performer. They have spent many months living in Marfa, Texas capturing video and audio material as a researcher would collect samples to be used under a microscope. The video material in the room will act as a sheet to cover the viewer and immerse them in the macro and micro elements of this land. Every corner is video mapped to drape across the walls of the room, transporting one back to the outside the exhibition doors. The sound of the live room including the participant will be mixed with the composition and live performance, which manipulates and distorts the view of the Western










landscape in reaction. The performer is the viewer and the creator, who will all manipulate and interfere with what is experienced and the audio acts as the ignition of interactivity. The field recordings and sound samples of the landscape are directed towards a 7.1 surround sound audio output for the multi sensorial attributes to be physically felt by the participant.






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
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

The elements and frequencies are tuned to match the surrounding area to reduce sound to its most fundamental aspect. Sound is defined to be a disturbance of matter that is transmitted from its source outward. A disturbance is anything that is moved from its state of equilibrium. The purpose is to relate the physicality of our environment, and within the installation space, create a multi sensorial environment to entice disturbance and resolution.


